RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A REDUCTION IN WORKFORCE IN THE LIVINGSTON COUNTY BUILDING DEPARTMENT – Building Department / Finance Committee

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Building Department has the primary purpose of assuring that buildings are sound, safe and sanitary through the enforcement of the State Building Code; and

WHEREAS, during the first 11 months of 2008, the number of residential building permits issued by the Livingston County Building Department was 1274, down from 1611 for the same period in 2007, a decrease of 21%; and

WHEREAS, this decrease in the number of building permits has led to a 31% decrease in daily inspections and a 13.1% decrease in total permits issued; and

WHEREAS, this decrease in demand for services necessitates the use of departmental retained earnings to cover the cost of operation and the continued erosion of retained earnings is unsustainable; and

WHEREAS, proactive corrective action appears to be necessary since there has been no correction in the downward trend in the building market.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners hereby concurs with the recommendation of the Finance Committee that it is now necessary to institute limited layoffs beginning February 9, 2009 and reduce the work hours of the remaining employees to 35 hours per week with the exception of the Building Official and the Deputy Building Official.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the last day employees must report to work shall be February 6, 2009.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said layoffs of non-union personnel shall be made pursuant to the Livingston County Workforce Reduction policy in the following manner: Two (2) full-time Building Inspectors and two (2) full-time Administrative Aides.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Building Official is authorized to delay the effective date of the layoff as it relates to one (1) Building Inspector to ensure that proper staffing is maintained within this discipline.

WHEREAS, Community Corrections has been awarded \$52,270.00 through the State of Michigan Community Corrections Grant funding to provide for an Intensive Out Patient (IOP) program; and

WHEREAS, this program will take place at Brighton Hospital, in Brighton, Michigan, in which funding will cover 55 participants at an approximate cost of \$960.00; and

WHEREAS, the 44th Circuit Court operates an adult drug court with Byrne Grant funding and the 53rd District Court operates a sobriety court with SCAO Grant funding, both of which are authorized by the Livingston County Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs' Bureau of Justice Assistance has announced enhancement grant opportunities for existing drug courts; and

WHEREAS, the Circuit and District Courts have notified the Board of Commissioners of their intent to apply for this funding through a unified application; and

WHEREAS, the grant request for FY 2009 - 2011 can be a maximum of \$200,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the proposed application will not change the scope of either program, but rather enhance the provision of services and capabilities of the Courts; and

WHEREAS, Livingston County's match share of the aforementioned Grant is less than 25% of the requested funding or an amount not greater than \$65,000 and funding is available in the combined budgets of Adult Drug and Sobriety Court Programs.

WHEREAS, the proposed contract will allow the Livingston County Jail to extend the term of the contract with Kathy Hittle, a teacher, to provide educational services to inmates at the County Jail; and

WHEREAS, the funds will be paid from Inmate Rec and Ed fund, which are the County's profit from Inmate Commissary; and

WHEREAS, the contract will allow the Jail to provide a variety of education services such as high school completion, GED, creative writing, life-skills and other specialized programs deemed appropriate and may vary dependent on jail population; and

WHEREAS, the terms of the contract will remain the same with an hourly rate of \$25 per hour, without benefits, for a total not exceed \$35,000 annually for the period of January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2010.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Livingston County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the contract, as referenced above for inmate education services with Kathy Hittle, for \$25 per hour for a total not to exceed \$35,000 annually, with the contract effective period from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2010.

RESOLUTION APPROVING A CONTRACT BETWEEN LIVINGSTON COUNTY AND THE HURON RIVER WATERSHED COUNCIL PURSUANT TO THEIR PROPOSAL FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF WATERSHED PLANNING SERVICES ASSOCIATED WITH PHASE II STORM WATER PERMIT REGULATIONS - Drain Commissioner / Infrastructure & Development / Finance Committee

WHEREAS, the Clean Water Act of 1972 established the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES); and

WHEREAS, 1987 amendments to the Clean Water Act require the US Environmental Protection Agency to develop a phased approach to regulating storm water under NPDES; and

WHEREAS, Phase II Rules were signed in 1997 to address storm water discharges from construction activities, light industrial activities, and small municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s) in urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, 2000 Census has determined that significant areas of Livingston County meet the definition of an Urbanized Area; and

WHEREAS, the designated communities have completed the permit application stage in compliance with the August 1, 2008 deadline for all collaborating Livingston County Phase II watershed participants; and

WHEREAS, affected communities have expressed the continued desire to work collaboratively with the County to reduce implementation costs; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Drain Commissioner has obtained a proposal from the Huron River Watershed Council to assist in watershed planning services associated with Phase II Storm Water Regulations; and

WHEREAS, participating communities will pay a pro-rata share of the proposed contract.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Livingston County Board of Commissioners hereby agrees to enter into an agreement with the Huron River Watershed Council, pursuant to their proposal dated November 18, 2008, in the amount estimated between a minimum of \$41,408 and not to exceed \$119,147 for Phase II Storm Water Permit Assistance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that work associated with the individual communities will commence only after an agreement is executed between the County and local units, designating the apportionment of costs among communities.

RESOLUTION TO SYSTEMATICALLY TRANSFER MONIES BETWEEN FUNDS - COUNTY ADMINISTRATION / FINANCE COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2009 Budget contains several types of transfers between funds; and

WHEREAS, the following types of transfers between funds are reflected in the budget:

GENERAL FUND	The General Fund appropriates a considerable amount of its operating funds to other County funds. The purpose of the appropriations is to subsidize operating programs or capital purchases, provide seed money for new projects, and General Funds share for internal services
DIRECT SERVICES	Direct Services provided by a department (Internal Service Funds: Building Services, Information Technology, and Car Pool) to different departments within General Fund and in other funds;
INDIRECT COSTS	Indirect Costs (Central Services Cost Allocation Plan) are billed to appropriate general fund divisions, which operate with federal and state funding, special revenue and enterprise funds to recover each funds proportionate share of the County's central administrative and support cost which are originally borne by the General Fund;
OPERATING CAPITAL	Miscellaneous Operating Capital Transfers are made from one fund to another fund to subsidize operating programs or capital purchases, or provide seed money for new projects

WHEREAS, requests for transfers and/or billings are received from the numerous County departments continuously throughout the course of the year to fund their operations; and
