
In March of 2007, our 9-year-old daughter was completely unexpectedly diagnosed with type 1 diabetes. While she was still hospitalized at Mott Children's Hospital/University of Michigan, the social worker for the Pediatric Endocrinology office told us about the Children Special Health Care program. At that point we had not even had time to think about the impending financial burden of a chronic disease. The social worker, Jane Burton, immediately helped us file for the program.

Upon returning home from the hospital Rachel was visited by one of her teacher's from church. She very gently and kindly broached the subject of finances and Rachel's diagnosis, asking if she could tell us about the program she works for. That teacher, and dear friend, is Ellen Leach. Ellen and her co-workers have been of incredible assistance to us many times throughout the past 4-years since Rachel's diagnosis. I never hesitate to call them for an answer or direction to find an answer to my question.

We are a middle class family with my husband working full-time and me working part-time. I never dreamt that we would need to take part in a government assisted Medicaid program at our income level. But, I am writing to tell you that this program is a lifesaver. I honestly do not know what we would do financially without this program. The hospital bills at the time of Rachel's diagnosis, with an intensive care unit stay, were astronomical. That aside, the monthly costs for diabetes supplies and insulin would quickly put us into financial crisis even now. And that monthly amount is a never-ending cost of having type 1 diabetes.

We would like to thank those who make this program possible. If the program were to ever be in jeopardy, we would stand up and testify to the necessity of this program even to those of us making a middle class income. God provides for us in ways we never expect and this program is surely a God-given help to our family.

**RE: Nurses Welcome Newborns**


I would like to thank you for making the Nurses Welcome Newborns program available. I cannot begin to describe how grateful I am that I was able to receive your services; Without them I am positive that I would not be successfully breastfeeding my son, Liam. When he was born, none of the nurses at the hospital were able to figure out what was going wrong in our breastfeeding attempts. Several visits and many phone consultations with the lactation consultant at the pediatrician's office left me with nothing to show except cracked, bleeding, extremely painful nipples. She finally told me she didn't know what else to try and referred me to an independent lactation consultant.

At this point, frustrating and painful practice breastfeeding sessions, bottle feeding, and pumping around the clock had consumed all of my time for three weeks, leaving me exhausted and emotionally drained. I became more and more convinced that I would need to find a way to come to terms with the "fact" that I would not be able to breastfeed my son. After trying for two and a half years to conceive and going through six cycles of in-vitro fertilization, the thought that I would never be able to experience breastfeeding or provide my son with all the benefits it provides felt devastating. With hope floundering, I called the lactation consultant I had been referred to only to be told she would not be able to see me until the following week. She suggested I look for other resources....

I had already called one of the La Leche League groups in the Ann Arbor area and left a couple messages, neither of which were returned. I had heard that there was support through the health department, but that it was based on financial need. Out of desperation, I figured that I could at least call and maybe someone would know of other avenues I could pursue. I was thrilled to learn that the Nurses Welcome Newborns program was not only available to me, but that a nurse would come right to my home. This was my last hope!

Linda Weiman, RN, visited me at my home and within an hour (an hour!) I had my first successful breastfeeding session with Liam! She is truly exceptional at what she does and had the Nurses Welcome Newborns program not been available to me, I am convinced Liam would be drinking formula today. I plan to feed him breast milk exclusively for six months and to continue breastfeeding through his first year. It means the world to me to know that I'm giving him the best start possible in life, and I owe it all to your invaluable help. Thank you!

What a tribute to our county and its emphasis on community health!

**Re: Terminal Ramp Project**

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The engineering plans and specifications for the construction of aprons, taxiway, and parking lot including airfield painting was included on the May 6<sup>th</sup> MDOT bid letting. A total of ten bids were received. The lowest bid of \$1,829,348.50 was from Zito Construction of Grand Blanc, this was 1.19% below the engineering estimate for the project.

This project is expected to begin the first week of July and will be mostly completed in early September. The top layer of asphalt in the parking lot and all airfield painting will be completed in 2012, after construction of the terminal building.

The local match for this project will be 2.5% (\$45,734) and will be advanced as a part of the Airport Loan Agreement.

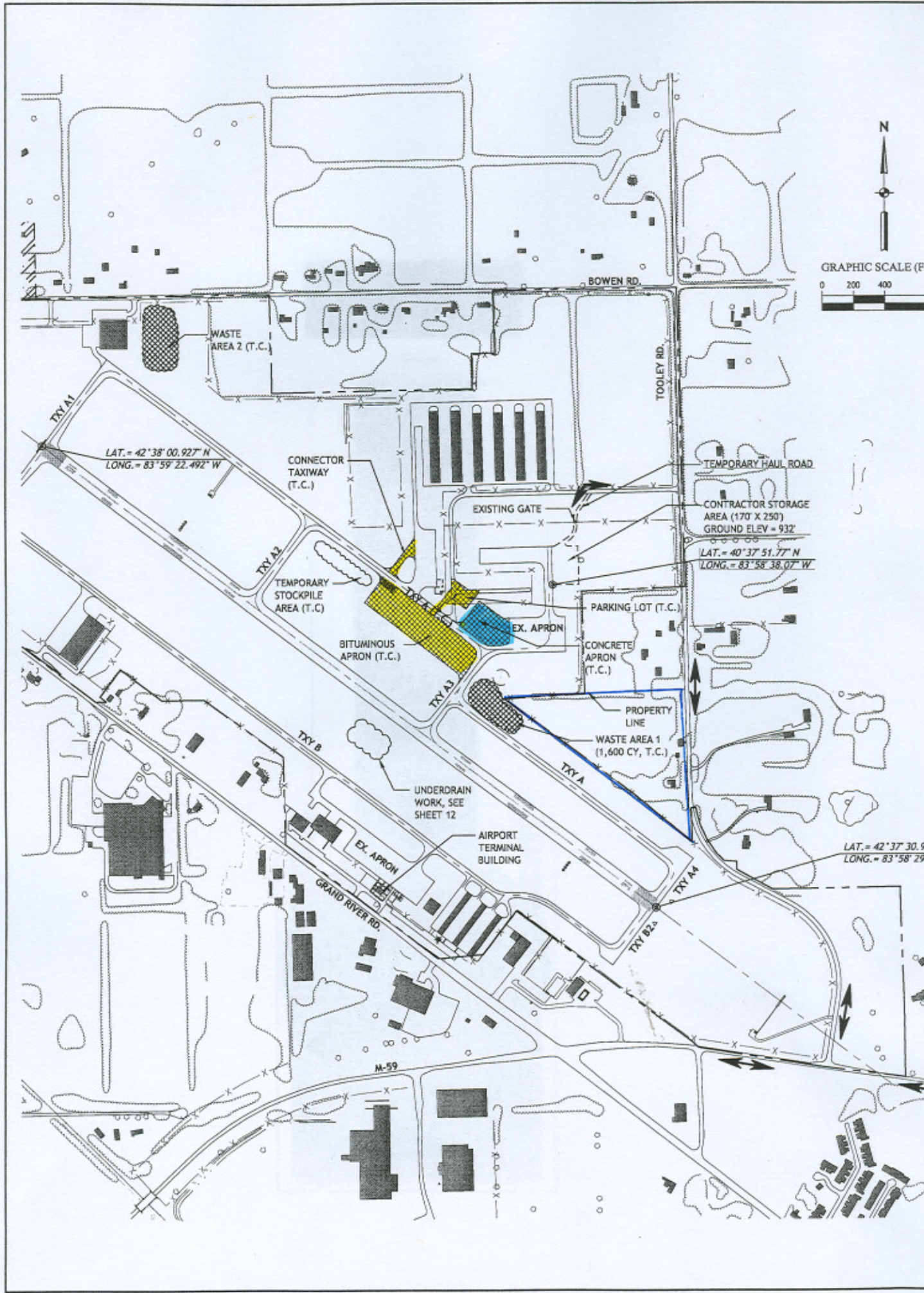

Re: Resolution Authorizing Use of the National Association of Counties (NACo) Prescription Discount Card for Livingston County Residents

Date: May 3, 2011

The County currently offers a prescription discount card through a provider used by Ingham County (Four D). The staff that assists in the administration of the Livingston Health Plan is the staff our department works with for authorization of the discount card. The parameters established by the Board for use of the County discount card was 60 years of age and older or disabled. A person can apply for the card online or by contacting our office. Once the information is entered a staff person must authorize the use by verifying that the applicant meets the criteria established by the Board. Once approved a card is sent to us within 5 to 10 days and then we in turn mail the card to the applicant. We have experienced a decrease in applicants since the Medicare Prescription Program began. We average between 5-10 applications per month.

The current card is not in high demand and the current process is cumbersome, not client friendly and takes almost two weeks to obtain a card. There are other prescription discount cards available, one through the State of Michigan (MiRx) MiRx must be submitted through an application obtained from a downloadable brochure and the applicant must be at or below the medium income level for the State. For a family of 2 the income level is \$42,000 and for a family of 4 it is \$63,600. Other discount cards exist and many can be obtained online however I have no knowledge of their operation or if any have been reviewed by a reputable organization.

If the County of Livingston wants to continue offering a prescription discount card I suggest that the Board give careful consideration to the card offered by the National

Association of Counties (NACo). First and foremost it is with a company that has been evaluated by a National Organization and currently in use by many of their members, nineteen counties in Michigan. Second, it is available to any person without prescription coverage regardless of age or income. Third, it does not require an application, access to a computer or printer or other verification process. The card can be distributed throughout the county for ease of pick up by any resident in need. Lastly, the card is a benefit of membership with the National Association of Counties.

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
