CC Sports Provides 2 Loaner Sea-Doos for Sheriff's Office

The Sheriff's Office extends a big "Thank You" to CC Sports for loaning two Sea-Doos to their office at no cost. The Sheriff's Office has a Marine Safety Program that patrols the County's waterways and enforces laws. The use of Sea-Doos is perfect for the Sheriff's Office because they are better suited for one-man patrol (when it is necessary), a Sea-Doo can be launched into small lakes and other locations that are not accessible to the Sheriff's patrol boat, and a Sea-Doo is more fuel efficient and maneuverable than a patrol boat. Updated Emergency Operations Plan

The Emergency Management Department has spent the better part of a year working to update Livingston County's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), which was recently approved and adopted in May. The goal of the EOP is to outline a plan to coordinate emergency response efforts to save lives, reduce injuries, and preserve property during local emergencies or widespread disasters. Although the EOP addresses emergencies, its primary goal is to assemble, mobilize, and coordinate a team of responders and coordinators that can deal with any emergency, hazard, or disaster our area may face. Through revision of the plan, the Emergency Department recognized the need to include an annex concerning IT and potential cyber incidents. When the Michigan State Police Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division reviewed the plan for approval, they mentioned that the IT annex was the first they had seen incorporated into an EOP and praised its addition. The EOP will be in effect for the next four years and will be periodically reviewed and revised as needed to ensure best responses. The updating process for the EOP involved the review and buy-in of many local agencies and partners. The Emergency Management Department thanks the local responders and agencies that worked collaboratively to review and support the EOP.

Resolutions Passed by the Board of Commissioners & Appointments

- An additional contribution of \$2.3 million will be made to MERS to reduce the total of the County's unfunded pension liability and future annual contributions. The funds for the additional contribution come from an appropriation that was authorized in the 2018 Operating Budget and a transfer from the 367 Debt Service Sinking Fund.

- Averhealth will provide drug and alcohol testing services for the Courts from June to September of this year with an option for a one year renewal.
- As tire replacement is part of routine vehicle maintenance and is essential to operating a safe fleet of vehicles, a contract for L.E.T.S. to purchase replacement tires from Randy's Service Station for a three year period has been approved.
- The County Treasurer has been authorized to establish the 2017 Delinquent Tax Fund. The Board has used Delinquent Revolving Tax Fund financing to settle delinquent tax account with governmental entities on a timely basis, and as a result, school districts and other local governments have been able to better plan and provide for necessary expenditures, often avoiding the necessity to borrow for operational needs.
- Allied Building Services Company of Detroit, Inc. will be replacing worn asphalt at the West Complex drive and the Historical Courthouse parking lot, as well as restriping the parking lot.
- Marshal Bowman has been appointed to the Sanitary Code Board of Appeals with a term expiring 12/31/2019.
- The following individuals have been appointed to the Airport Zoning Board of Appeals:

- Livingston County Paramedics will attend a Special Pathogens Response training at the Center for Domestic Preparedness in Alabama. The training will be provided by FEMA.
- The Board has approved the levy of the 2018 Allocation Millage in compliance with the requirements of Act 5, Public Acts of Michigan 1982.
- The Circuit Court will apply for State Court Administrative Office Grant Funding to operate Specialty Courts and Programs. Funding will be used for staffing, treatment, drug and alcohol testing, and training for specialty programs.
- The annual budget process and calendar for 2019 has been approved. This process and calendar will be used to prepare the 2019 Operating Budget that is a Policy Document, Operation Guide, Financial Plan, and Communication Device.

Pending Resolutions

- The Board will consider approving an agreement with Heystek Contracting Inc. for construction services for the Phase 1 Improvements for Fillmore County Park. Along with the agreement, the Board will consider a supplemental appropriation to increase the construction budget for this project.
- The Board will consider a resolution in opposition to the legalization of general use of non-medical marijuana.
- The Purchasing Department is asking the Board to consider a three year contract for uniform cleaning services with 2 Your Door Cleaning, LLC.
- The Airport will ask the Board to concur with the Livingston County Aeronautical Facilities Board to enter into a consent to mortgage agreement with Chemical Bank, on behalf of Hawk Hollow Farm LLC for the building that has been constructed on the Airport's leased land.
