

GOT LATEX PAINT?

Latex paint is water based, and requires only soap and water clean-up.* Leftover latex paint can be stored for years by:



- placing plastic wrap over the can opening,
- making sure the lid fits tightly, and
- storing the can upside-down.

How do I dispose of latex paint?

Dry out & put out with your trash:

- Remaining paint can be spread on cardboard, scrap wood, or drywall, or
- Dry the paint out by following these steps:
- In a well-ventilated area away from pets and children, open the containers to expose to air, or line a box with a heavy duty trash bag and pour the paint into the liner. The more paint is exposed to air, the quicker it will dry out.
- You may add kitty litter, shredded paper, sawdust, or other absorbent material.
- When completely dry, leave lids OFF the cans and place all next to your trash on your regular trash pick-up day.
