<b>517-546-4126</b>	<b>Community Mental Health (CMH)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Behavioral health care that promotes recovery and wellness, fosters resilience, and supports self-determination and empowerment so individuals are successful in achieving their personal goals and dreams</li> <li>Substance abuse services</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Must reside within Livingston County</li> <li>Adult with severe mental illness, a child or adolescent with a severe emotional disability, or a person of any age with a developmental disability</li> <li>Live in the county where services are being requested</li> <li>Have Medicaid or are enrolled in MICHild or Adult Benefit Waiver (ABW) program/can't afford cost of services</li> <li>Services must be medically necessary</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Medicaid eligible, enrolled in ABW Program, MICHild, or have no insurance and can't pay</li> <li>Private insurance + meet criteria for services, referred to agencies that accept insurance</li> <li>Special situations- serve individuals w/ other insurance, but no guarantee of services if no \$ from other sources; may be on waiting list</li> </ul>	Anyone	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Emergency = same day service</li> <li>Face-to-face intake assessment within 14 days of referral</li> <li>Once authorized, services begin within 14 days of assessment w/ a preliminary plan in place</li> </ul>
<b>517-548-0200</b>	<b>Department of Human Services- Adult Services Division (DHS)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Home Help Program- Independent living services to provide a range of supportive and assistance related services to enable individuals to live safely and in the independent setting of their choice.</li> <li>Information and referral to other programs and resources that may help meet their needs</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adults who are Medicaid-eligible</li> <li>Adults who have personal care needs in addition to Independent Activities of Daily Living (IADLs), which include housekeeping, medications, shopping, laundry, meal prep</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Must be Medicaid eligible</li> <li>18 or older</li> </ul>	Anyone	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Food assistance: 30 days</li> <li>Expedited food: 7days</li> <li>Medicaid: 45 days</li> <li>Home help Services: 45 days</li> </ul>

517-540-6888	Michigan Rehabilitation Services (MRS)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To prepare people to secure, retain, or regain employment consistent with their abilities and capabilities</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Physical/ mental impairment constitutes or results in substantial employment impediment</li> <li>Requiring vocational rehabilitation services to achieve an employment outcome consistent with abilities and capabilities</li> <li>Demonstrate ability to benefit from services unless determined unable to benefit by clear and convincing evidence</li> <li>Cannot be legally blind</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>N/A</li> <li>Social Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability Income (SSDI) applicants are accorded the presumption of eligibility</li> </ul>	Anyone	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Intake = week</li> <li>60 calendar days from referral) = Determine eligibility</li> <li>90 days support services (fade over time)</li> <li>Post-employment services- within 90 days of case closing</li> </ul>
